ABOVE SPIRIT fits nicely with this group although more distance would be appreciated; this is his first try since the Valedictory in December when he made a strong middle move and finished on the edges.

PERFECT BULLET is an improving four year old who handled Poly track well when introduced to it May 11th; he rallied sharply for a maiden score; he worked in company with Jungle Brew June 4th getting ready for this in 1.00.4.

BATTLE ZONE is getting his first race beyond a sprint; at seven furlongs in this category last time, he challenged the winner through the stretch but was finally third with Field Commission second.

MARKET GAIN has sharp closing ability; he was third last time after being hindered by slow early fractions in a seven furlong race; he extends to a route.

WONDEROUS GLORY was in a first allowance classification sprint two starts ago and ran well to be fourth beaten two lengths and the winner has come back to score; most recently, he closed belatedly on turf.

SALISH woke up when dropped for maiden \$32,000 and sent a route last time; he stalked the pace and drew off.

FIELD COMMISSION is a sharply developing three year old who handed seven furlongs well on a stretch out last time to be second against a key winner; the extension to a route, is a logical move for him.

FORTY CREEK was not a factor in his seasonal bow sprinting; he prefers going two turns and stretches out but is in against a key group.

BULLONTHEWIRE closed a good gap two starts ago against Perfect Bullet and was seventh beaten seven lengths and that one was entered in the opener; most recently, he was overmatched in a nine furlong race when handcuffed by slow fractions; he should welcome the drop for \$50,000 claiming.

EL PATRONE competed in a slowly run route for \$37,500 and closed relative to the rest to be third of 11; he has the benefits of a recent work in 49.

PROPENSITY is typically slow out of the gate and has lost in double digits in all three events to date; he now runs with a tag for the first time; he was the work mate of Solitaire in his move June 14th at Saratoga in 1.02.2.

GREY BOUNDARY should be ready to move forward and challenge now that he has had a return race; that was an out of the money finish on turf; now that he gets back to a Poly track route, he has a chance to challenge.

BE NICE TO JOHNNY closed relative to the others June 7th without threatening in a slowly run route for \$40,000; this will be his third start of the campaign.

MUTAKAMI is dropping in for a tag for the first time and extending beyond a sprint for the initial time; he was out of the money against a key winner last time and that one has already come back to score; he has been busy with preps for David Bell. **QUINNER'S CIRCLE** stayed on nicely in a route for \$40,000 two starts ago to be third; most recently, he sprinted with a drop; he attracted a claim and was only fifth.

DIDYAGETITDONE is a career sprinter who will now experiment with a route and so the distance factor is a challenge; he moved from 13th to be sixth last time at six furlongs.

IF WHAT SO WHAT had a return race on turf May 31st and with that race out of the way, he now comes up tagged for the first time, stretches to a route and moves back to Poly track; he worked recently getting ready for this for Nick Gonzalez.

VEGAS ANGEL is only a one time winner and is facing non winners of three after a recent out of the money finish on turf.

D BOLD RULER was overmatched in the recent Steady Growth Stakes when stretched to a route but did finish fifth of 11 and in front of some nice rivals; he was severely inconvenienced by a slow pace and a come from behind style two starts ago at only seven furlongs; he fits with these.

CAN BE VALID overcame a slow pace to run second two starts ago in a seven furlong race at the first allowance classification; most recently, he fell in with Ontario sire runners but his off the pace attempt did not work when slow factions were established; he extends to a route; he used the sprint to route angle to win last December.

NEAR NOISE had no chance when trying to run from off the pace against sleepy fractions May 23rd; he did well in routes last season and should welcome the stretch out.

SAND COVE has been freshened since a victory against non winners of two May 16th; the late pace in that race was quite good and it was an improved event all around for him; he gets his first career route here and faces some who are usually victims of slow pace structures.

AGNICO is a logical one to stretch out now that he has had two sprint races; he was off the pace against slow fractions last outing, yet, finished third and in front of some of these; he fits.

MONEY SPITTER is a developing type who benefitted when stretching from a sprint to a route last time to beat non winners of two and the third place finisher has already come back to win; he has come back to work in 1.01.4.

KARANKA a homebred, will debut for Mark Casse; she is a daughter of Congaree, a multiple Grade 1 stakes winner in New York and California; Husbands was aboard for an easy blowout June 18th in 51bg.

FIDDLESTICKS a homebred, debuts for veteran Glenn Magnusson; she is bred to be fast; her dam Whistling Maid was a rapid type who did well as a juvenile; she has exhibited speed on a regular basis in her works.

C KARMA a homebred, will go for Greg De Gannes; she is by Exchange Rate, the sire of Southern Exchange a winner of the Victoria Stakes; her major work came June 8th in 1.00.2; Clark who has been aboard in the morning, gets the call.

POPPIN a first time starter for Steve Asmussen, is by City Zip, a Grade 1 winner as a juvenile; she blew out June 18th with speed in 34.3; she goes lasix free.

POSSE FATALE a first time starter for Greg De Gannes, is by the quick Posse and from a dam that was a two time stakes winner; she had gate action June 14th in 49.4hg getting ready.

REBECCA'S SONG is beautifully bred by Rahy and from a dam that was a stakes winner in England; she had big velocity in a June 7th work and has subsequently reported a work in 48.4.

CARELESS JEWEL a first time starter for Josie Carroll, is quick; she a half sister to Black Tea who was a juvenile winner; she worked May 30th in 46.2hg getting ready and blew out for this with Ramsammy in 34.

VAN LEAR ROSE a homebred, will debut for Catherine Day-Phillips and is a half sister to the recent winner, Third Time Lucky; she prepped June 14th in 47.3 getting ready.

LOLA B. had a positive opener in an upper claiming event May 24th providing a good stretch gain when third; she gets a little more room here against much better rivals.

MOUNTAIN ECHO a first time starter for Tony Mattine, has Eurico Rosa Da Silva aboard; she is a daughter of Tempered Appeal, a stakes winning juvenile; she had a quick work June 14th in 47.4.

WISE KNIGHT looks to be coming to hand; he ran a route in his opener and was fourth; he cuts back to six and a half furlongs and gets the tough rail post.

EFFTEESSEE was skimpy odds with a big drop for \$10,000 last time but unfortunately lost his rider at the start; he does have winning history; Matt Moore takes over.

JUDGMENT DAY drops in value after an 11th place finish in his seasonal bow where he was no factor at any stage.

DEMI SONG was beaten almost 30 lengths at Fort Erie last time by some of the best ones there; he drops down and shortens to a sprint for \$12,500.

CAPTAIN KYLE goes for a productive jockey/trainer combination; he had an ok third at seven furlongs last time and the runner up has since scored.

STORMY LOVER is capable of a productive stretch charge on his best day; this is his third race off the shelf and he should be peaking now.

DANCINGONTHEGREEN is the wildcard in this race; he has already used the drop down angle to win after a double digit loss and does it again after a poor effort on turf last time.

BOLD TENSE moved sharply in the stretch to win at six furlongs last time, his second win in four starts during this campaign; he remains viable.

LIKELY took a big drop two starts ago but wasn't good enough; he also failed as the favourite last time; now he drops for \$12,500; the runner up from his last race has come back to win at an elevated level.

J. B.'S VICTORY was taken to Fort Erie to ensure a score May 25th but was second at even money and was claimed; he had hit a peak here the time before for \$16,000 when second best.

JUDITHS JEWEL closed a good gap at six furlongs last time in a vastly improved race to be fourth beaten a length by Bold Tense.

MINDY'S ISLAND had a poor experience at Fort Erie on Tuesday in the slop and is back on a quick return with the transfer home.

COOL THE HEAT is getting his first start of the season; he was a two time winner last year; he likes a late running style and Daniel David rides.

SPINFIRE had a poor result May 24th in the same race where Captain Kyle was a stronger third; he has worked regularly this month.

LOMAKI is an exciting prospect who is developing quickly; she is one of three daughters of A. P. Indy in the race along with Serenading and Catch The Thrill; she doubled up here May 10th in a first allowance classification race in very good time at seven furlongs; she has trained smartly in the interim with Pizarro aboard for Chiefswood Stable.

MY LIST has now won three consecutive sprint stakes with an impressive off the pace style; she has some adjusting to do here with the extension to a route; she finished well in a recent work in 59.2 with Da Silva.

IT'S TRUE LOVE is a newcomer here for Dan Vella; she will be getting her first start since April when she was out of the money on turf in Maryland; she scratched on Wednesday; she was a stakes winner at Delaware last year at this distance.

SERENADING has prepped smartly coming into this event after a narrow loss in the prep for the Nassau Stakes which went on Poly track May 9th; the one that beat her, Callwood Dancer, came back to win the Nassau; she broke through the gate pre race in that last event and had to be reloaded.

CATCH THE THRILL a winner of the Princess Elizabeth Stakes as a juvenile, is hoping to regain top form; she was a winner of her seasonal bow in a second allowance classification route at the beginning of the month.

THUMBIN' A RIDE was successful going long at Pimlico in the spring of 2007; she was second recently in a sprint behind London Snow who subsequently captured the Ballade Stakes.

HUMBLE JANET was successful when brought here by Steve Asmussen; she captured a second allowance classification route with a significant rally; most recently, she was moved to turf and didn't react as well.

ARDEN BELLE a triple stakes winner last season was no factor in the Nassau Stakes in her seasonal bow; she gets back to her best footing on Poly track.

BEAR NOW is looking to rebuild her form after consecutive in the money finishes; she moved well in the Grade 2 Dupont on Preakness day at Pimlico but sagged late; she has trained well since then; she gets the widest post with Baird; she captured this event last year against a key runner up.

PAULIFF'S PRIDE ran a good race last time in this category at this distance when second beaten two lengths; Stein retains the mount; she has had an interim work in 1.01.1.

CATURIANA had every chance to win a race June 13th but couldn't put away the leader but managed to hold on to second with a final quarter in 26.1; she doubles in price here.

YOU REALLY GOT ME continued to improve May 28th in her third run of the season; she had a breakaway victory as the favourite; she has the benefits of an interim work for Robert Tiller; she now tries non winners of two with a boost in price.

AUBURN SPEEDSTER concluded last season when coming off the shelf to win September 6th; she is fresh again now and has been going quickly in gate preps for Sylvester Ollivierre.

CASSIA HEIGHTS is trying to move forward now that she has had a return trip on turf; that came for \$40,000 and it was her first race since 2006; she goes to Poly track and drops sharply; Dancer's Fan exits the same event.

HP HIP HOORAY was on the edges in this category at six and a half furlongs last time behind a longshot winner.

DANCER'S FAN is plunging and hopeful of her first win since 2006; she was fifth beaten just two and a half lengths for \$40,000 on turf last time when moderate fractions worked against her rallying chances.

DANZATHRUTHEKNIGHT drops sharply for just \$20,000 here; the drop down angle worked for her back in April; most recently, she was fourth behind a key winner in an Ontario sire event.

BELLA CREEK had a seasonal bow May 23rd but was ineffective against the runner up, Pauliff's Pride.

TACTICAL took sharp support in her second start of the meeting June 8th and ran much better with an approach close to the pace throughout and she was third in this category; she now extends to a route for Steve Asmussen.

COLD WAR competed at Presque Isle last time in a route event where the winner was 12 lengths the best and the runner up was nine lengths clear; he lacked velocity in that event and was a distant third; he cuts back to a sprint and adds blinkers.

STACK THE PADS ran a good race when on the edges two starts ago for \$30,000 at five furlongs when fourth and Neil The Knife was second; that rival was also in front of him last time when he was out of the money on turf after a less than ideal beginning.

OK NOTHANKSFORASKN ran well in a couple of races in Philadelphia earlier this season; since coming home to Poly track, he hasn't been as effective; for \$32,000 last time, he had the pace in his favour but faltered.

TWISTED WIT benefitted when the pace was in his favour two starts ago to win at seven furlongs for \$32,000; most recently, he encountered too fast a pace and backed away in a protected spot; he drops down to the price of his previous win.

CAPTAIN RAUCOUS hasn't competed since May 9th when fourth when lasix was added and Silver Gun was inches in front of him in third; he seeks relief with the drop for \$32,000; he is a five time winner on Poly track.

GOTAGHOSTOFACHANCE ventured here from Santa Anita May 10th and was the best runner but was disqualified for mid stretch interference; most recently in a third allowance classification event, he was inconvenienced by a slow pace while drawing the rail post; he plunges for this event; he blew out in 34.1.

GREAT ADDICTION has been a strong contender in his last three events with a win in early May and subsequent in the money finishes in his last pair; he followed the winner along the rail June 8th when reporting in third for \$47,500; he fits.

NEIL THE KNIFE stayed on well in a turf event June 1st at six furlongs from a wide post; he always had good positioning; he ran equally well in his previous Poly track attempt.

SILVER GUN was handcuffed by slow fractions and that ruined his off the pace chances against Twisted Wit last time.

FROMAJACK TO A KING did things much differently second time out this season; he stretched to six and a half furlongs and was already rallying to the lead by mid stretch and was a half length the best for \$20,000; he now looks to build on that event and has come back to work in 1.00.3.

MANLIEST looks like a wake up prospect with the drop; he was out of the money and non threatening on turf last time at a route; he seems to do his best with off the pace sprint efforts and shortens to a sprint here on Poly track.

GUN HIGHWAY changed equipment last time and was on his best behaviour while running on the lead to win by three lengths for \$40,000; the second and fourth place finishers have since won; he came back to work in 59.3; he already has a win on the turf from his juvenile season.

DISCREET COMMANDER is making his fifth consecutive appearance in a stakes event; he won the Display Stakes as a juvenile; most recently, he was third in the Victoria Park but no match for Catch Air who is here; he sees turf for the second time.

CATCH AIR is very fast on turf as he showed when winning in February in New Orleans; most recently, he was strong on the pace in the Victoria Park Stakes when caught only late by an import runner and he kept Discreet Commander behind him; he should be well situated on the front end here.

COLD HARBOR is trying turf and stretching to a route for the first time after a fifth place finish in a recent maiden event.

FLYING DISMOUNT comes in for trainer Christophe Clement; he is from a dam that did win the South Ocean Stakes here; he was a double winner at Tampa over the winter and then just missed in the Palm Beach Stakes at Gulfstream when unable to overcome traffic problems; he was also inconvenienced by a poor trip last time at Calder; Woodbine's wide open E. P. Taylor Turf should be more to his liking.

MENIFEE SIX was in a first allowance classification race on turf last time where he closed to be on the edges; he has since worked in 59.4.

CRYPTONITE KID looked good on the turf as a juvenile; he returned to the lawn recently but was disappointing from a difficult inside post.

MARLANG ruined his chances with an inefficient break from the gate last time; he had run progressively in his previous event on Poly track; he worked quickly on turf June 8th in 58.4.

TIVERTON had an excellent speed try when moved to Poly track May 18th in a race that came off turf; he made the pace until deep stretch setting brisk fractions then was beaten by a predictable one who has come back to score; he shortens to seven furlongs.

STONETOWN dropped sharply June 1st for \$40,000 to win on turf surviving a hectic pace battle; he was claimed and now goes to the stable of Noel Randall and has had time for a comeback work in 49.2.

STUNNING STAG switched to turf last time where he ran willingly in third after an unusually slow beginning; he was thriving here on Poly track last December and now makes the surface switch.

BOLDER THAN BRASS was not competitive in the stretch in a six furlong event at the second allowance classification last time against Gotaghostofachance who was entered in race eight.

DOZEN DANCER won as expected first time out and was able to double up in his second start despite a considerable letdown in form; he gets his third race and is jumped to the second allowance classification for an acid test.

CARYSFORT LIGHT like some others in here, is switching from turf to Poly track; he was out of the money last time when Stunning Stag was a better third.

GONE MISSING was a fringe player at Oaklawn Park in March in an ok effort; this will be his first try since the middle of May when he was out of the money on turf in Texas; he worked with Wilson June 15th in 48.4hg.

MORADA KEY is certainly worth considering given his big effort in an added money race at Arlington Park on Poly track last time when second after an outside close; he has two wins in 20 starts with six runner up finishes.

MALAKOFF was third in the 2006 Queen's Plate; he was first across the wire in the Prince Of Wales but was demoted and was shelved; he makes his way back now for Brian Lynch in a seven furlong sprint; he worked Wednesday in 48.3hg to sharpen up.

HIS SMOOTHNESS ran ok in his seasonal bow in this classification when close to slow fractions which is not his best style; apprentice Giddings takes over.

KNIGHTLY ATTIRE was out of the money on turf last time but on the edges and gaining late in behind Stunning Stag; he was a winner on Poly track two starts ago.

WATHS UP PATRICK moved over to turf for his seasonal bow May 28th and was not a factor while closing belatedly.

FREEDOM COVE is getting his second start of the season and is moving from a sprint to a route and from Poly track to turf; he is adding lasix; he was no match for One Adam Twelve last time.

ONE ADAM TWELVE ran well two outings ago in an Ontario sire event when second at 3-5; most recently, he tried open maidens with hopes of advancing but the slow pace handcuffed him; he moves to turf for the first time and gets back with Ontario sire runners.

THIRDKIN ran well on the turf last time but gave up the lead late and I'm A Little Fish was second.

I'M A LITTLE FISH ran unexpectedly well in his seasonal bow May 28th when a charging second along the inside on turf to finish just in front of the favourite, Thirdkin.

SEPTEMBER SQUARE attracted a claim two starts ago; he was fourth last time against a dominant top pair in an Ontario sire event going long on Poly track.

FLASH OF TIME was on turf last time and handled himself well with a strong stretch gain before hanging to be on the edges against I'm A Little Fish.

DA SUFFERING was on turf two starts ago and closed mildly but I'm A Little Fish was a more solid second.

JUSTICE PREVAILS has been working on turf and hopefully gets a chance to run on the lawn here; he is seeking his first share.

TEACHER BOYNE used a drafting trip last time and got room late and finished second behind a strong winner; he is stretching to a route and he enters for turf.

BEARS TARGET closed willingly in his seasonal bow to be fourth; most recently, he had a more aggressive trip against fast fractions and was third; he now stretches out and enters for turf.

TROJAN MONKEY had a significant letdown at 6-5 in his last start as he finished out of the money; he had run a peak race the time before; he recently worked on turf in 59.3 in preparing for this shift in surfaces.

WITNESS TO ALL will be seeing turf for the first time after closing belatedly in recent Poly track events; he is looking for a breakthrough in this third race of the season.

FULL OF WISDOM was only eighth last time on Poly track going long in the same race where September Square was fourth and he has been entered.
